

## **About the Fellowship**

The NATF Traveling Fellowship Program is an annual scientific exchange opportunity for physicians, scientists, pharmacists, nurses, or physician's assistants developed to promote exploration of cross-disciplinary diagnosis, treatment, education, and research related to thrombosis. The program was conceptualized to allow scientists and healthcare professionals the opportunity to expand their fund of knowledge, as well as build positive and enduring relationships with others concerned with thrombotic disorders.

NATF Traveling Fellows are selected by the NATF Advisory Committee chaired by Dr. Sasahara. Recipients are recognized as leaders in science and medicine with the potential for lowering the national rate of life-threatening thrombotic episodes through education, research, and prevention.

NATF Traveling Fellows spend 10 to 30 days visiting a North American medical, research, or education center of their choice, during which they work on a joint project with the hosting center. In addition, Fellows participate in scientific symposia with members of the NATF Board and Scientific Advisory Committee, and present learnings gained through the NATF Traveling Fellowship at the 2010 North American Thrombosis Summit.
