# **North American Thrombosis Summit 2010**

**September 25, 2010**

**Fairmont Copley Plaza Hotel, Boston, Massachusetts**

## **Program Overview**

The North American Thrombosis Summit 2010 is a comprehensive multidisciplinary overview of major issues concerning antiplatelet agents, new anticoagulant therapies for venous and arterial thrombosis, insulin resistance on cardiovascular disease in Type II diabetes, optimal duration of VTE prophylaxis, thromboembolic pulmonary hypertension, and anticoagulant drug safety. The Summit's objective is to improve patient care through the advancement of thrombosis education. State-of-the-art presentations will incorporate perspectives from translational science, clinical research, prevention efforts, educational initiatives, public policy, and advocacy. A panel discussion with members of NATF's Scientific Advisory and Advocacy Committees is incorporated into the agenda. More than 30% of the curriculum is devoted to discussion, questions, and answers. The course will integrate viewpoints from academic, community, government, and patient perspectives.

## **Target Audience**

This program is intended for patients, advocates, office-based physicians, hospitalists, nurse practitioners, nurses, pharmacists, physician assistants, hospital administrators, and policy makers.
